Career Guidance Workshop - A career guidance workshop was held on 21st May 2019, by the Delhi Child Rights Club (DCRC). 60 children from 15 DCRC organizations participated in the workshop facilitated by Mr. Ram Kishore, Faculty and Training officer, ITI, Nizamuddin, New Delhi. The adolescents found it useful and informative. A fairly significant numbers of them are looking forward to join the Indian Technical Institute (ITI) after higher secondary school.

Butterflies School of Culinary & Catering (BSCC) - Trainees from BSCC learnt to prepare new dishes like Chowk Tikki and Hari Chutney. They also had outdoor catering experience at Naaz Foundation, UNICEF, and Delhi Metropolitan Education Institute.

Cultural Afternoon - The monthly Cultural Afternoon was held on 28 May 2019. Almost 260 children & staff from Butterflies participated in the program. Children from all the contact points put up a variety of performances like poetry recitation, songs, dance and short plays. The stupendous performances won a thundering applause from the audience which helped children improve their self-confidence and find their hidden talents .

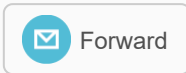
