Action movies which star Akshay Kumar, music and reading are a few of Rohan's favourite things.


















































- Remember you have a right to say no. You must not tolerate any unwanted look or touch or violation.
- You must find somebody (a responsible adult) to confide in.
- It is never your fault. You are not to blame. It is entirely the fault of the abusing adult.



How to protect your child

- Try to establish a comfortable and free atmosphere at home. Encourage your child to talk to you on all issues. Tell her/him that it is wrong for an older person to ask her/him to keep a secret about sexual touching or exposure, even if that person is a family friend or relative.
- Teach your child how to say "no" to an older person if he/she touches her in a way that makes him/her feel uncomfortable, or if an adult wants to have his private parts touched.
- Make the child comfortable with his/her body and do not attach any feelings of shame to it.
- Believe what your child tells you and be alert to small changes in his/her behaviour.
- Know where your child is at all times. Be familiar with your child's friends and their daily activities.
- Beware of adults who pay an unusual amount of attention to your child giving them inappropriate or expensive gifts.
- · Give your child emergency numbers where they can call if they sense danger.
